
The lack of specific knowledge on the instruments and regulatory models, and the urgency translated from the Executive Offices to regulators, commonly derives in:

- Replication of international models (e.g.: REACH or TSCA) without local adaptation or Regulatory
 Impact Assessment
- Conflicting regulatory frameworks and approaches being adopted within the country and the region.
- Unjustified time and costs requirements for companies to comply with regulations.
- Negative impacts on commerce, trade and innovation and, in the end, a lost opportunity for cooperation.
